Creating A Career Pathway For High School Students



## THE JOB DEMAND

- Based on EWIB's nationally-recognized Manufacturing Pipeline Initiative (MPI), which has placed ~4,500 individuals in jobs.
- Curriculum recognized by the Eastern Advanced Manufacturing Alliance (EAMA) which consists of ~50 manufacturers in Eastern CT.
- General Dynamics Electric Boat anticipates hiring 17,000 people in the next 10 years.

## THE TRAINING

- 150 hours of hands-on training taught during school.
- Gain foundational manufacturing job skills.
- Receive YMPI certificate for career pathway, earn college credits towards a certificate or degree, and pre-apprenticeship hours.

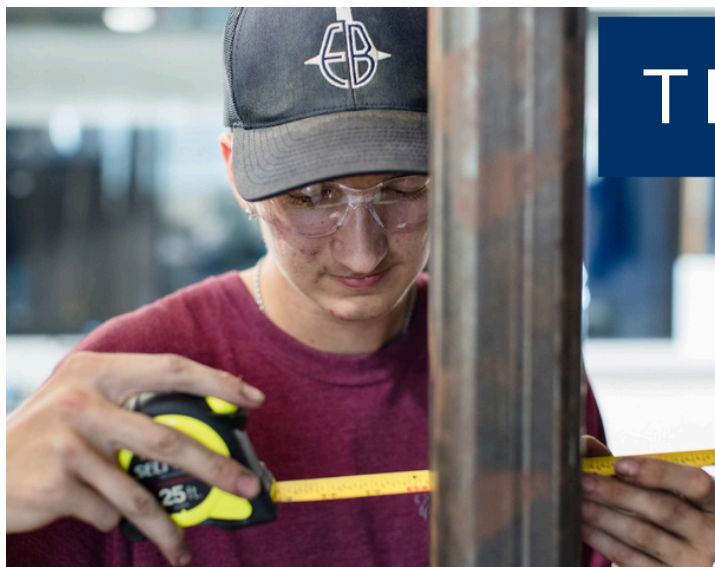


## THE OUTCOME

- Guided job search assistance is available upon successful completion.

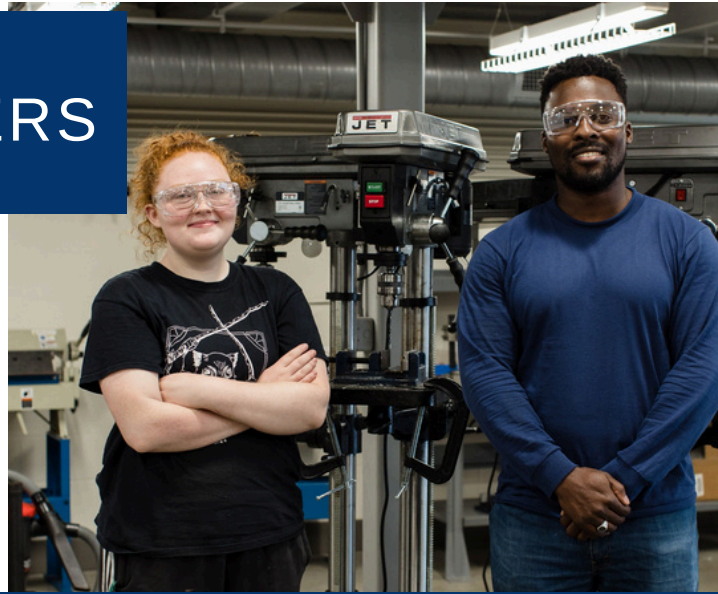
### HIGH DEMAND, COMPETITIVE SALARY

The YouthManufacturingPipeline Initiative will give you foundational skills to be successful in an entry level career in manufacturing.

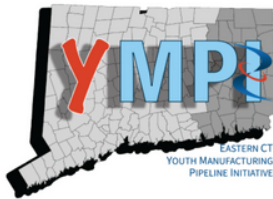
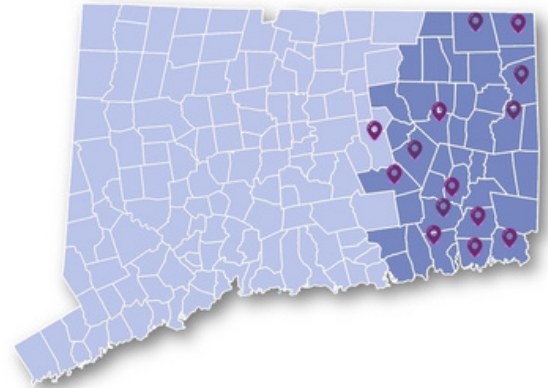
