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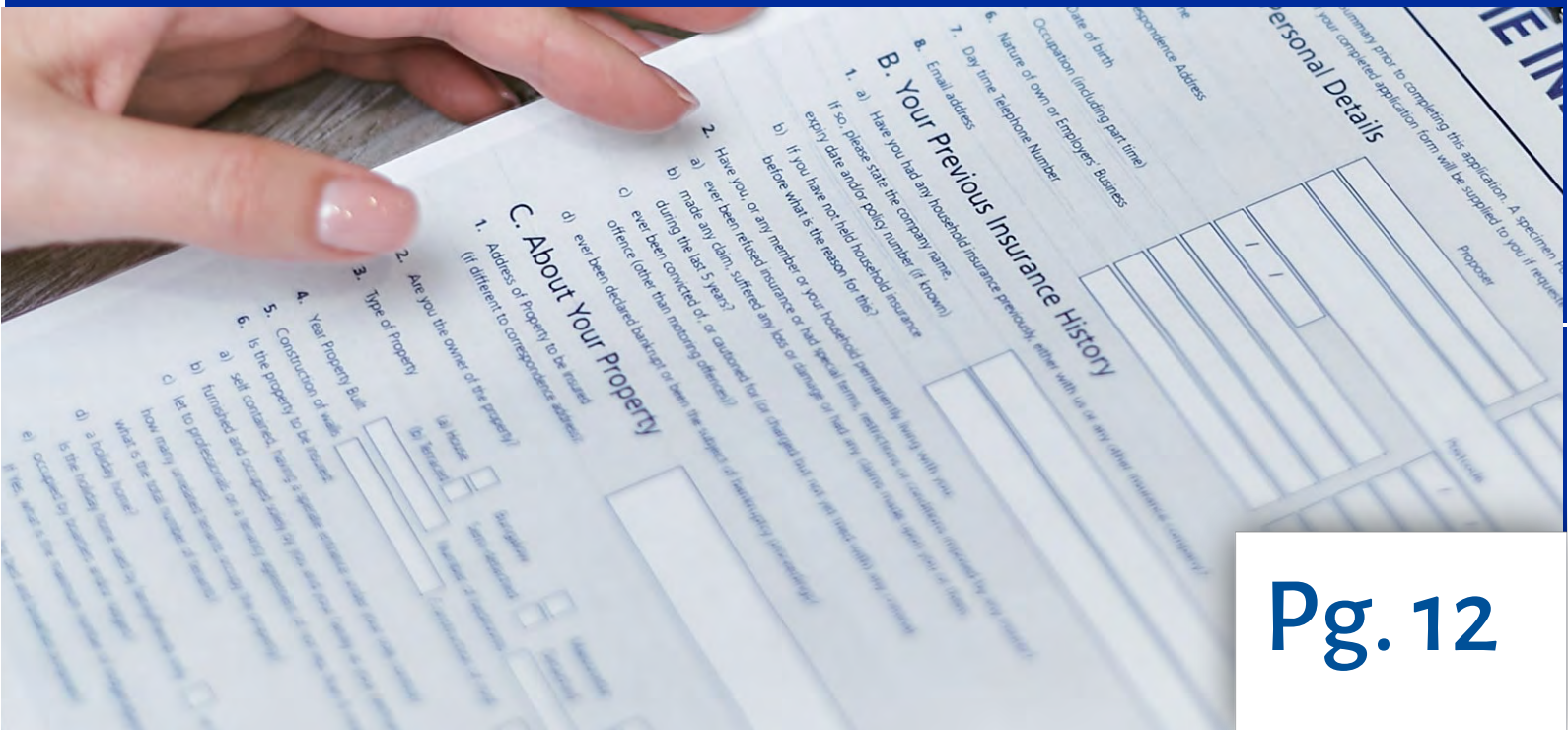
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Services for Job Seekers

American Job Centers (AJCs) offer a comprehensive array of **no-cost**, convenient services to jobseekers, available both **virtually and in-person**. Our centers provide individualized support, referrals to partner organizations, access to valuable resources, and a broad range of workforce development tools.



From career exploration and planning to résumé assistance and job search training, AJC career counselors are ready to guide you. They also provide labor market insights, help overcome employment barriers, and assist with skills assessments and job transitions. Additionally, AJCs host in-person hiring events, giving you direct access to employers ready to hire.

Career Services, Skills Training and Education Services

Adult Education Services

Whether supporting high school completion for adults, offering job training, providing essential English instruction, or delivering parenting support, our Adult & Community Programs are designed to empower adults in our community. We are committed to helping individuals of all ages and backgrounds gain lifelong skills, expand opportunities, and pursue goals that lead to a brighter future.

Vocational Rehabilitation & Disability Services

Aging and Disability Services (ADS) supports individuals at all stages of employment—whether you're working, job seeking, or currently unable to work. Explore job training and vocational rehabilitation services for people with disabilities and older adults. ADS connects individuals to meaningful employment by aligning their skills with employer needs.

Apprenticeship Opportunities

Apprenticeship, in simple terms, is a program of "learning while earning." Unlike other vocational training, which is held in a school setting, apprenticeship is based solidly on an employer-employee relationship. As an apprentice you will receive paid on-the-job training and academic instruction that will prepare you with the skills needed to advance you in your chosen trade.

WIOA Program

The Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) offers federal funds to help eligible adults (18+) access career services, training, and education. It supports job seekers, including those with disabilities, veterans, dislocated workers, displaced homeowners, and ex-offenders. Intensive help is available for those with limited skills.

Career Services, Skills Training and Education Services (Pipeline Initiatives)

For many jobseekers, access to training is the key to securing a well-paying job. The Eastern CT Workforce Investment Board (EWIB) offers financial support through Individual Training Accounts (ITAs) to help make this possible. Eligible American Job Center (AJC) customers collaborate with Workforce Advisors to create a personalized Employment Plan and choose an approved training program. This process is guided by a comprehensive assessment of the customer's current job skills, job readiness, employment & training goals, financial and social circumstances, and likelihood of successfully completing the program and gaining employment. Manufacturing Pipeline Initiative

The Eastern CT Manufacturing Pipeline Initiative provides no-cost training to address the hiring needs of Electric Boat (EB), other members of the Eastern Advanced Manufacturing Alliance Regional Sector Partnership (EAMA RSP), and other manufacturers. Program Highlights:

- Includes short-term classroom training
- No prior experience is necessary
- Financial supports available

Applicants that are authorized to work in the U.S. are eligible for the program.

Healthcare Pipeline Initiative

The Eastern CT Healthcare Pipeline Initiative provides **no-cost, short-term training** to address the hiring needs of members of the Eastern Connecticut Healthcare Partnership, and other regional Healthcare Employers.

HPI participants receive no-cost training, support services to promote program completion, and job search support. No previous healthcare experience is required to participate. Training programs include: **CNAs, Dental Assistants, EKG Technicians, EMT, Medical Assistants, Phlebotomy and more!**

Services For Youth

Youth initiatives are aligned with local labor market needs and integrated with community youth services. These programs build strong connections between academic learning and career-focused skill development. Through volunteer opportunities, & paid work experience, youth are encouraged to grow as leaders and engaged citizens. In partnership with local organizations, EWIB promotes and supports collaborative efforts that help young people gain the skills needed to enter the workforce, continue their education, and pursue meaningful careers. Together, we develop strategic action plans and oversee a range of youth programs, training opportunities, and career pathways to support the region's future workforce.



WIOA In-School Youth Program: COOL (Careers of Our Lives) Directions

- Academic support, career assessment and transition planning
- Career exploration and labor market information in the form of career inventories, field trips & job shadowing, to explore emerging industry fields along with visits to colleges, technical schools, & businesses
- Job placement/ internship/ work-based learning opportunities,
- Financial literacy, basic skills in reading & math and life Skills training
- Leadership and team building skill development

Youth Healthcare Pipeline (YHPI)

The program offers skills training, leading to industry recognized credentials, for high school students that will pursue a Healthcare career. The credentials will enable immediate employment into entry level healthcare careers such as C.N.A and EMT.

Youth Manufacturing Pipeline (YMPI)

The program offers manufacturing skills training, career exploration, work-based learning, and other career development & awareness opportunities to high school students interested in a manufacturing career upon graduation.

WIOA Out-of-School Youth Program: Jobs, Education and Training (JET)

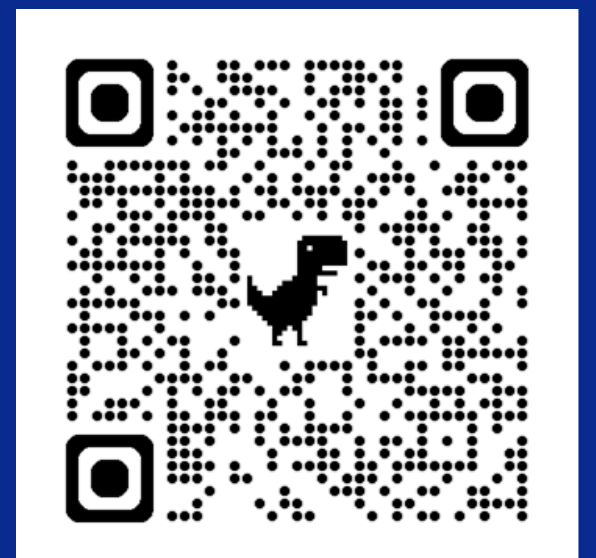
- Career Exploration: Take part in paid internships, on-the-job trainings, job shadows, job searches and more.
- Work Readiness: Gain skills in resume writing, dressing for success, interview techniques, and more.
- Education & Training: Obtain a free high school diploma or GED. Flexible scheduling and part-time attendance are offered. Financial assistance and transportation is available for eligible participants.

Connecticut Youth Employment Program (CYEP)

This initiative is designed to provide meaningful work experiences to young people aged 14 to 24. The CYEP is a program of the Eastern Connecticut Workforce Investment Board (EWIB) in partnership with EASTCONN, New London Youth Affairs & Thames Valley Council for Community Action (TVCCA).

The CYEP offers participants opportunities to engage in paid work experiences during the summer months, typically spanning 6 to 8 weeks. In addition to work experience, the program includes workshops on job readiness, financial literacy, and career exploration, aiming to build both hard and soft skills.

Services For Veterans

American Job Centers (AJCs) in Eastern Connecticut are committed to serving the men and women who have honorably served in the United States Armed Forces by offering specialized services tailored to veterans, including individualized career assistance and access to veteran-focused employment programs. **Veterans are given priority of service, ensuring they receive expedited access to job search assistance, skills assessments, career counseling, and workforce training programs.** Whether transitioning from military to civilian life or navigating a mid-career change, veterans can benefit from one-on-one support with professional staff who understand the value of their service and are equipped to translate military experience into marketable skills for today's labor market.

Through the Disabled Veterans' Outreach Program (DVOP), eligible veterans with significant barriers to employment—such as service-connected disabilities, homelessness, low income, or involvement with the justice system—receive intensive case management and personalized employment planning. These services are designed to help veterans overcome challenges and build sustainable career paths.

In addition, **Local Veterans' Employment Representatives (LVERs)** engage directly with employers to promote the hiring of veterans and to coordinate veteran-focused recruitment events, job fairs, and employer briefings.



Veterans also have access to specialized workshops on resume writing, federal job applications, and interviewing strategies, as well as referrals to education & training opportunities funded through programs such as the GI Bill, Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA), and Vocational Rehabilitation and Employment (VR&E). AJCs work closely with regional partners, including the Connecticut Department of Veterans Affairs, community-based veteran support organizations, and local employers to ensure veterans have a clear pathway to success in the civilian workforce.



Supports And Other Services



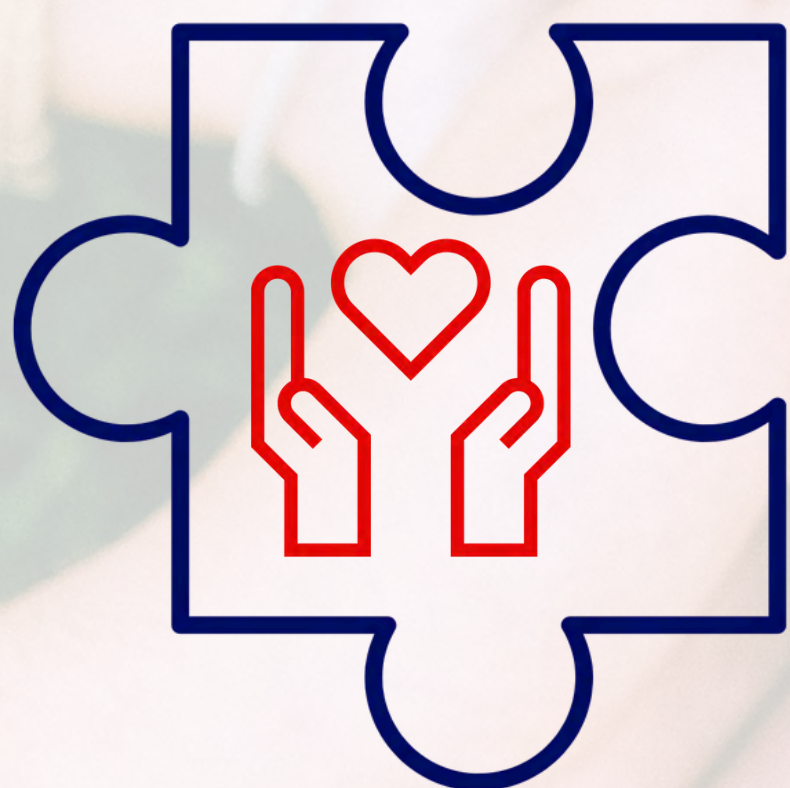
Reentry Programs

Eastern Connecticut American Job Centers (AJCs) offer reentry programs designed to assist individuals with criminal justice involvement in successfully reintegrating into the workforce. These programs provide a range of services, including job readiness training, employment assistance, and support services tailored to the unique needs of justice-involved individuals.



Rides For Jobs

Don't have transportation? We've got you covered! Administered by the Eastern Connecticut Transportation Consortium (ECTC), this **short-term** program provides transportation assistance to **AJC-enrolled**, income-eligible customers (no self-referrals). Support covers travel to jobs, job searches, interviews, training sessions, and childcare. Options include local bus and van services, mileage reimbursement, and other car-based solutions. **Funding is limited.**



Human Services Support

Eastern Connecticut American Job Centers (AJCs) offer human services support to help individuals overcome barriers to employment. Human Services Specialists at these centers can connect job seekers with assistance for basic needs such as housing, food, transportation, healthcare, and childcare. These services are designed to support individuals in achieving their employment goals by addressing challenges that may impede job search or retention.

AJC Policies

To maintain a fair, professional, and productive environment, please follow the following AJC policies. AJC staff may monitor all activities in the AJC. Any violation of these policies could result in loss of privileges, up to and including termination of services.

COMPUTERS:

- Computer usage is limited to 2 hours per day
- Knowledge and ability to use a computer is required – ask the front desk about computer-related workshops
- Computers – including personal email – may be used for job-search-related activities only
- Files created on AJC computers must be saved to the customer's email or a flash drive – not to the computers
- Inform a staff member about issues with the computers
- No food or drink is allowed at the computers

COPIER/FAX/MAIL:

- Mail and fax limit of 5 per day
- Customers may only mail or fax job- or program-related documents
- Limit of 10 copies of job-related documents per day

Important: For your own protection, please sign out of online accounts and discard any personal documents before leaving the AJC.

CELL PHONES:

- Keep phones on vibrate
- Step outside to make/take calls

PERSONAL ITEMS:

- Keep personal items with you at all times. The AJC is not responsible for lost or stolen articles.

CHILDREN AT THE AJC:

- The AJC is a place of business. If you have a staff appointment or are visiting the AJC for job search activities or to use computers, we suggest that you arrange care for your children. Customers who bring children to the AJC are responsible for monitoring their children, and the AJC is not liable for injury to children in the AJC. Children are not allowed in workshops.

VIRTUAL SERVICES:

- An Internet-connected computer, laptop, or smart phone is required to participate in virtual services – talk to an AJC staff person if you do not have Internet access or a device.

COMPLAINTS:

- Should any problems or grievances occur in an AJC, please immediately request to speak with an AJC supervisor, who will attempt to resolve the problem in a fair and timely manner.

OTHER POINTS TO REMEMBER:

- Customers must check in at the front desk EVERY TIME they visit the AJC
- The AJC has a ZERO TOLERANCE policy for disruptive or threatening language/actions directed at staff or customers at the AJC, on the phone, or online. This will be addressed immediately and accordingly.
